Requirements to work in New Brunswick 2026

Steamfitter Journeymen in New Brunswick are required to have a Certification of Qualification number to work in New Brunswick. This only needs to be completed once to work in the province of New Brunswick. You will need to submit an application online for "Equivalent Standards" through the AMS (Apprenticeship Management System). One time cost of \$150.00.

Step One

Deposit Travel Card to our local. We have a travel card list, once your card is deposited, we add it to our list. As we need Travel Cards, we go down our list. We do not leave messages if there is no answer we keep moving down the list.

To be dispatched we require the following information:

1. N.B. Certification of Qualification (CQ) Number or Equivalent Standards for NB number.
2. Fall Protection
3. Confined Space
4. Basic Safety
5. WHMIS 2015/GHS
6. Valid 3M 6000 series fit test

Courses are only recognized through NBCSA or a Construction Association. Energy Safety (formerly OSSA will be accepted).
